Keep Australia Beautiful judge Averil Bones will visit Raspins Beach later this month.

“There are so many reasons why Raspins Beach has been chosen as the Tasmania winner of the **Keep Australia Beautiful Clean Beaches** program and therefore they will be very competitive when the national judging takes place,” she said.

The national awards will see Raspins Beach judged on its community action and partnerships, litter prevention methods and waste management, as well as environmental, water conservation and energy innovations.
